ORDINANCE NO. 1002

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAFFIC WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF COTTONWOOD FALLS, KANSAS; INCORPORATING BY REFERENCE THE *STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE FOR KANSAS CITIES 2026*, 52RD EDITION , WITH CERTAIN PENALTIES AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 996.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF COTTONWOOD FALLS, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. INCORPORATING STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE. There is here by incorporated by reference for each purpose of regulating traffic within the corporate limits of the City of Cottonwood Falls, Kansas that certain standard traffic ordinance known as the *Standard Traffic Ordinance of Kansas Cities* Edition of 2026, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas. No fewer than three copies of said Standard Traffic Ordinance shall be marked or stamped "Official Copy" as Adopted by Ordinance No. 1002, and to which shall be attached a copy of this ordinance and filed with the Chase County Sheriff's Department, Municipal Judge and all administrative departments of the city charged with enforcement of the ordinance shall be supplied, at the cost of the city, such umber of official copies of such Standard Traffic Ordinance similarly marked , as may be deemed expedient.

SECTION 2. TRAFFIC INFRACTIONS AND TRAFFIC OFFENSES.

- (a) An ordinance traffic infraction is a violation of any section of this ordinance that prescribes or requires the same behavior as the prescribed or required by statutory provision that is classified as a traffic infraction in K.S.A. 8-2118.
- (b) All traffic violations that are included within this ordinance and which are not ordinance traffic infractions, as defined in subsection (a) of this section, shall be considered traffic offenses.

SECTION 3 EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its publication the official city newspaper, The Council Grove Republican.
