Scheduled Visitors

- Linda & Geneva Lawrence, owner and representative for the property located at 712 4th St, and Enforcing Officer Dorneker appeared before council for the hearing to discuss the dangerous structure at this location. Dorneker will schedule a walk-through of the house to determine if there have been improvements made. Larkin made a motion to allow time for an inspection by the Enforcing Officer and have the Lawrences' attend the August 1st meeting with a list of things that will be completed including a firm end date. Studer seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- Steve Schlup, owner of 521 Union, notified a councilman that he would be out of town at the
 time of his dangerous structure hearing. Several improvements to the property are scheduled
 for the near future. Sisson made a motion to postpone the hearing with Schlup's until the
 August 1, 2016 meeting. Studer seconded the motion. Motion carried. City Clerk will send
 notification that the hearing date has been moved.

Enforcing Officer

 Enforcing Officer Dorneker has inspected the property at 220 7th St. Several improvements have been made to the interior of the home, such as new flooring and new pipes. Dorneker will be making an additional inspection in a few weeks to check for continuing progress. No action taken.

Mayor's Report

- Ron Love will begin working on the log jam beginning with the logs that have lodged against the pillars soon.
- AT&T is planning to run an underground fiber optic line for the new 911 system from Highway 50 down Main St to KS-177 and then south to the jail.
- Discussion was held regarding THE Fair Board's plan to build a gazebo on the patio south of the Community Building, noting that it may be desirable to move the air conditioning units to the East side of the building.
- The welcome marker on the North edge of town should be installed by the end of the summer.
- The property located at 336 Pine has been demolished and leveled.
- The large dead walnut tree in front of 333 Pine was also removed.

- The County is planning on starting around August 1st on the chip/seal project.
- Emporia Construction & Remodeling scheduled to begin the next few weeks. Should be completed the end of August.

- Crew has been busy mowing and working on the Disc Golf Course.
