#### Mayor's Report

- Sheriff Dorneker contacted Mayor Baumgardner regarding the Cruise Night on Broadway Saturday, October 2<sup>nd</sup>. The consensus of the Council is to get suggestions from Dorneker on setting some regulations and have Dorneker speak with the organizers of the event.
- The special meeting held on September 29<sup>th</sup> including the City Council and the Planning
  Commission was held. They agreed upon a set of criteria to change the building code, including
  at minimum square footage of 500 square feet for residential homes and a list of acceptable
  building materials. No new building permit applications will be accepted until the ordinance has
  been updated. Another special meeting is scheduled for October 17<sup>th</sup> at 5 p.m. in the Council
  room.
- Discussion was held regarding the log jam. At this time, the water is still too high to get an
  excavator in to remove the logs. Once the water recedes, the logs will be cut up and the jam
  removed.
- The City has been approved for the \$500,000 grant through the Kansas Department of Wildlife,
   Parks & Tourism for the proposed low-head dam project that the City had previously applied for.

## **Utilities Supervisor Report**

- A letter explaining the regulations of the ordinance and a copy of Ordinance No. 715 was
  delivered to Jessica & Cameron Murphy and Murphy Agri, LLC. The city wants them to be aware
  of the regulations to avoid anything toxic getting into the sewer system that could kill the
  lagoons and the effects of too much groundwater getting into the system.
- Jones and Baumgardner met with Paul from Emporia Construction & Remodel. They looked at several projects throughout town including the water fountain installation at Main and Broadway, concrete work that needs to be done at the pool, the new drain at the river bridge and other work needing to be done at the bridge. Paul is working on a quote.
- Sheriff Dorneker would like No Parking signs to be placed on the south side of Friend by the high school. Jones will get more exact information. The consensus of the Council is to allow the signs

to be put up but they would like to set a time frame for the no parking so that it would only restrict during the time that buses are loading/unloading.

- There was a water leak at 7<sup>th</sup> at Cedar on September 30<sup>th</sup>.
- Kansas Rural Water Association believes they will have the maps done in the next few weeks.
- The city crew will be working on hot mix and spraying for mosquitos this week.
